Globalization Will Increase Inequality

Global inequality (the relative inequality of incomes among all peoples in the world) raised from 1820 to about 1990. This increase was driven by different growth processes among countries. Inequality within countries was stagnant or falling over much of this period, most notably over the middle half of the twentieth century.
